## Sumner County Election Commission Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes Tuesday, January 10, 2017

Atchley, Administrator of Elections and Annette Haw, Assistant Administrator of Elections. - Old Business

- II. <u>New Business</u>
  - A. <u>Inspection-New Processed Voter Registration Applications</u>
    Prior to the meeting called to order, Commissioners Kemnitz, Polston, Ehmling and Staten inspected 48 new processed voter registration applications as required by statute with no discretions noted. All Commissioners signed the report.

  - C. Report from Administrator

AOE Atchley reported on the memo that was just received from Coordinator of Elections Mark Goins dated December 21, 2016, subject: "Possible 2017 Legislation on List Maintenance Program". It stated that this possible legislation could affect how you conduct your list maintenance program which your office may not purge voters due to non-activity for the previous two (2) November election cycles, nor may your county send a confirmation notice and make a voter inactive due to non-activity for the previous two (2) November election cycles. AOE Atchley stated the SCEC has to sit and wait for a decision on how to conduct the List Maintenance Program which could impact the SCEC postage and labor budget. AOE Atchley stated SCEC has some 20-25,000 people inactive in Sumner County.
