REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES Thursday, November 21, 2024, 4:00 p.m.

Members present: Chairman M. Allen Ehmling; Secretary Denise D. Shepherd; Commissioners Patricia D. Collins, J. Michael Fussell and Jeffery B. Hulsey (arrived at 4:01 p.m.). Also present: Lori D. Atchley, Administrator of Elections and Annette Haw, Assistant Administrator of Elections.

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chairman Ehmling with a motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Collins and the motion passed 4 - 0. A quorum was present.

II. APPROVE AGENDA

Commissioner Fussell made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Collins and the motion passed 4-0.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

IV. APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Collins, seconded by Commissioner Fussell to approve the October 18, 2024, Special Call Meeting Minutes and the motion passed 4-0.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. NEW BUSINESS INSPECTION – APPEAL PROCESSED VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS

There were no appeals.

B. INSPECTION - NEWLY PROCESSED VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS

Commissioners inspected 311 voter registration applications out of 3,108 new registration applications with no discrepancies noted. Commissioners present signed the report to be submitted to the State Division of Elections.

C. REPORT FROM ADMINISTRATOR

FACILITY UPDATE

AOE stated that the ad hoc committee appointed by the CC to make recommendations regarding the permanent location of the SCEC met on October 31, 2024, and did not extend an invitation to the SCEC. The CC meeting that was held on Monday, November 18, 2024, regular CC meeting included an item for consideration for the CC to vote on if the Law Director would submit a proposal to the SCEC regarding a relocation plan. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Law Director was unable to attend and the matter was deferred.

BUDGET UPDATE

No Change: however, per the last Budget Committee meeting, no appropriations or other monies shall be transferred from other accounts unless an emergency. AOE sent an email to Finance Director David Lawing regarding his request that AAOE correct negative account lines. AOE stated in the email that since the SCEC budget was not property funded, there were no funds to move the negative balances into these accounts and that the Law Director and CC would need to address the matter.

OTHER

AOE advised the Commissioners that the Coordinator of Election called on November 4, 2024, and relayed that a Davidson County Judge had issued a court order to Sumner and three (3) additional counties that instructed the respective counties to count one specific convicted felon's vote, although the AOE had not received the approval letter from the State Division of Elections. AOE was told the State Division of Elections was considering appealing the decision.

- Motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Collins to certify the combined results of Robertson/Sumner counties for the City of Millersville, and the motion passed 5 – 0.
- Motion by Commissioner Hulsey, seconded by Commissioner Collins to certify the Sumner County portion for the City of Millersville Municipal Election, and the motion passed 5 – 0.
- Motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Hulsey to certify the Sumner County portion for the City of Portland Municipal Election, and the motion passed 5 – 0.
- Motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Hulsey to certify the combined Robertson/Sumner counties for the City of Portland Municipal Election, and the motion passed 5 – 0.
- Motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Hulsey to certify the City of Westmoreland Municipal Election, and the motion passed 5 – 0.
- Motion by Commissioner Hulsey, seconded by Commissioner Fussell to certify the City of White House Municipal Election, and the motion passed 5 -0.

VI. REPORT FROM ELECTION COMMISSIONERS A. CHAIRMAN

Chairman Ehmling initiated a discussion regarding Election Day results reporting. AOE stated that Early Voting and Absentee Vote results had historically been

reported together as most candidates and voters consider them to be similar, as they are votes cast before Election Day. However, due to an unusually large number of Absentee ballots (two large double stacked mail trays) received by the Post Office prior to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, per statute these ballots had to be processed by the Counting Board. Therefore, the reporting of the results was delayed. Chairman Ehmling made a motion to report Early Voting totals when the last voter had voted in Sumner County, and to post Absentee results when available, and Precincts as they arrived and were processed. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hulsey, and the motion failed 2-3.

B. ELECTION COMMISSIONERS

Commissioners Collins and Shepherd stated they had received comments concerning the SCEC uniforms. AOE stated that the uniforms were the colors of the State of Tennessee flag and were a primary color so poll workers could be readily identified by voters, and the majority of poll workers and voters were appreciative of being able to identify workers. AOE also stated that there were many other blue color elements (blue jeans, blue tablecloths, blue provisional bags, blue ink, etc.) that were utilized during voted. Both Commissioner Collins and Shepherd wanted to note comments received by some poll workers and voters, although the uniform is not mandatory.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

Motion by Commissioner Fussell, seconded by Commissioner Hulsey to adjourn the meeting and the motion passed 5-0. The meeting was adjourned at 5:43p.m.
