

Qualifying petitions for municipal offices will be available beginning Monday, June 20

Qualifying petitions for residents interested in running for municipal offices in seven Sumner County cities will be available at the Sumner County Election Commission beginning Monday, June 20, 2022.

The cities of Gallatin, Hendersonville, Millersville, Mitchellville, Portland, Westmoreland and White House will have municipal elections in conjunction with the Thursday, November 8, 2022 Federal and State General Election. Offices on the ballot for each city include:

- Gallatin: Mayor, Alderman at-Large, one Alderman each for Districts 3, 4 and 5 and City Recorder;
- Goodlettsville: Two Commissioners voted on at-Large;
- Hendersonville: One Alderman for each Ward 1 through 6;
- Millersville: Two Commissioners for full four-year terms and one for a two-year unexpired term voted on at-Large;
- Mitchellville: Mayor and three Alderman voted on at-Large;
- Portland: Mayor and three Alderman voted on at-Large;
- Westmoreland: Mayor, two Alderman full four-year terms and two for two-year unexpired term voted on at-Large;
- White House: Mayor, one Alderman Wards 1 and 2 and City Judge.

Candidates for the City of Goodlettsville, which is partially in Sumner County, will pick up petitions for office at the Davidson County Election Commission, 800 2nd Ave. in Nashville beginning on Monday, June 20, 2022.

Residents of Robertson County who are potential candidates for the White House offices on the ballot must also pickup their petitions at the Sumner County Election Commission.

Qualifying petitions for the Gallatin, Hendersonville, Millersville, Mitchellville, Portland, Westmoreland and White House must be returned to the Sumner County Election Commission office by NOON, Thursday, August 18, 2022.

The Sumner County Election Commission office is located in the Sumner County Administration Building, 355 N. Belvedere Dr., Room 106 in Gallatin.
